Going Deeper

This morning I was looking at the Lectionary Texts and hoping to find a verse or two that would connect with a big day in our church . . . Kirchenfest. I struck out with the Lectionary, so I found myself scouring in Jeremiah, and there it was.

In Chapter 31 God says, *“There’s a day coming . . . a day when I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts . . . No longer will they teach their neighbors . . . because they’ll all know me.”*

I love that . . . God’s gonna download His law (aka Divine Wisdom) into their minds AND hearts. Both function as receivers, both have intelligence, both bear and share, and both are critical for our becoming through our cognitive and cardinal knowing. And I’m guessing you’re aware of that, the heart knows things the mind doesn’t know and that goes both ways. We know via both Mind and Heart.

And that’s the connection to my text and to St. Peter’s version of Kirchenfest. It’s a time to remember and celebrate the experience of Confirmation and how a community “downloaded” theology, doctrines, history, and moral teaching into the Mind.

At the same time, there were spiritual truths and realities that were finding a home in their Hearts. The Divine Truths were being received via relationships and love and spiritual practices and beauty and joy and play. Are you with me?

And who knows in what ways lives were impacted by such an experience in the years to come. That’s why we celebrate and say, “Thanks be to God” for St. Peter’s Church.

You may have noticed that there's a new Goodwill store in Taylor, but please remember our local thrift stores with your donations and shopping dollars.

In addition to meeting the needs of our most vulnerable neighbors, Shepherd's Heart and St. Vincent de Paul are sources of low-cost clothing and household items for area residents. The toys and children's items are especially helpful to families during the Christmas shopping season.

Shepherd's Heart at 121 East 2nd Street in Taylor is supported by local churches, including St. Peter's. Proceeds go to the Food Pantry, which distributes groceries to more than 400 local families weekly. The store is open Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday, 9 am to 3 pm.

St. Vincent de Paul store at 209 North Main Street in Taylor is operated by St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church. Proceeds help area residents with emergency assistance for rent, utilities and medicines. It's open Monday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 10 am to 3 pm.
