Visit from the Nickel Family of Germany

In researching his family, Reiner Nickel of Germany learned that his great-great-grandfather, Gottlieb Nickel, had a brother named Christoph. Along with his wife and children, Christoph moved from Dessau, Germany, around 1895 and settled in Coupland.

Some of you may remember the Nickel family who lived and farmed just east of Coupland, and a number of Nickels are buried in St. Peter's Cemetery.

Reiner was able to initially find Christoph and his family using the web site <u>FindAGrave.com</u>, which lists millions of graves including all the graves in St. Peter's Cemetery. After Reiner contacted St. Peter's, Ted Wittliff put Reiner in contact with Larry Nickel, who grew up here and now lives in La Grange.

Larry is the great-grandson of Christoph Franz "Frank" Nickel, Sr. (1842-1912) who, along with his wife Henrietta, is buried in our cemetery. Larry is the son of Elton and Ruth (Beyer) Nickel, who are also buried here.

On May 30, Reiner and his wife, Annett, traveled from Germany and visited Coupland. They met for coffee at the church with **Ted Wittliff, Danny Smith** and **Mick Lemp,** along with **Larry Nickel** and his family, then went to the cemetery to see the family graves.

What an amazing story and such fun to meet the European branch of our St. Peter's family!


