FROM THE PASTOR

Just over a year ago, as Julie and I began learning about St. Peter's, we were excited to see that you all were a congregation that appreciated a legacy of worship that was centered in the Church Calendar, which guides Christian worship around the world. It's a great historical gift to churches that takes us deeper and deeper into our experience with God. It gives us a rhythm to awaken the soul and a calling to walk with Jesus.

This rhythm begins year by year with the season we call Advent. It is a word and a practice (well over 10 centuries old) that invites us into quiet reflection and preparation. We reflect on our lives, our journey, our world, and we prepare, anticipating the coming of the Christ. The season of Advent can take us into repentance, awareness, rest, compassion, celebration, and a beauty that draws us into the Christ . . . again.

Year by year churches have their ways of expressing and living out Advent. Julie and I have been a part of several churches where I have led and each church had the familiar elements, Hanging the Greens, Advent Candles, the Chrismons, the music of the season, etc. But they also had "church specific" traditions, things dear to them. And they also change this and that, which can be a good thing . . . right . . . um right?

I share this because Advent is near and I want to share some things that have been meaningful to me. For instance, I have "worked to wait" (another word for Advent) and not get to the nativity right away, holding it for Christmas Eve . . . we wait and wait together. Another practice is for children to participate in various ways throughout the services, which is what I'm preparing to do. I like to have a song for the season that is sung while the next candle is lit. Julie and I have moved decorations sometimes or created something new. We're also going back in forth between blue and purple year to year (radical, huh).

So, here we go into this beautiful journey and season together.

November 3, 2025

Memorial Fund: Fund reports by Ted and Michele were reviewed. Council agreed to identify items for usage of Memorial Funds, specifics to be discussed at Council Retreat. Ted will continue to work with Jennifer Tatrow (and Kandice) for more accurate Memorial reporting totals from year to year.

Council Member Nominations: Three open Council positions will be on the ballot at the Annual Congregational Meeting on January 18. Anyone interested in serving on Council should contact Michele Dupy by January 11.

Insurance: Council approved the property and liability renewal quote from United Christian Insurance Group for \$16,364.48. Liability limits will be confirmed.

Pastor Benefits: Rev. Burt's catch-up reimbursement approved for July to October for health insurance contribution and cell phone, per the terms of his contract. Jennifer Tatrow to cut check and include reimbursements automatically moving forward.

Events: December 2025 Christmas events schedule was discussed.

UCC Installation: Rev. Burt's UCC installation is scheduled for January 25, 2026.
